Summary of alerts – Countries to monitor – Calendar

Focal points in August

Colombia	Chocó struck by an earthquake measuring 7.4 , at least 331 people dead, 4,505 injured, more than 449,000 people affected across 16 departments, particularly in Pereira, Cali and Quibdó 10/08. National state of emergency declared.
Persian Gulf	Further suspension of Air France flights and United States call for people to leave the region 01/08 , amid renewed tensions. Exchange of strikes between Iran and the US (5 killed on Larak Island 30-31/08; in retaliation, Iran launched missiles and drones at military bases in Jordan (8 intercepted) and the UAE (drone shot down). Repeated Houthi strikes in Yemen (at least 58 killed 6-7/08 and in Marib and Hadramaut), and against Saudi sites and oil tankers.
Indonesia	Earthquake measuring 7.7 in Flores 15/08, leaving at least 111 people dead and causing significant material damage , continued aftershocks for 2 weeks.
Nepal/Tibet (China)	At least 1,066 people killed and 4,462 missing, including 844 foreign tourists, in deadly flash-flooding and mudslide of the Bhote Koshi, affecting Gyirong (Tibet) and the districts of Rasuwa and Nuwakot (Nepal) 26/08 .
Niger	Attempted coup 29/08 : large-scale fighting broke out in Niamey between mutinous soldiers and the Presidential Guard, including at Air Base 101. Although the mutiny is reported to have been quashed, the situation remains unstable.
DRC	Ebola outbreak death toll rises to over 2,500 with more than 5,000 cases as of the 21/08. Outbreak spread to Bas-Uélé Province. Travel restrictions in place in areas under rebel control. Roadmap agreed between Kinshasa and M23.

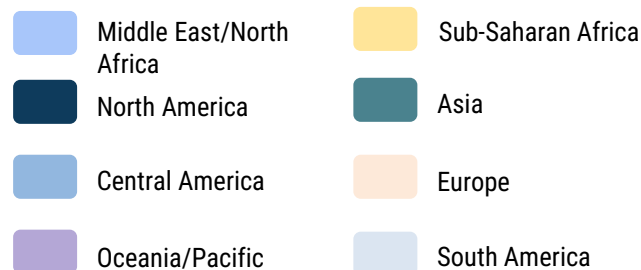
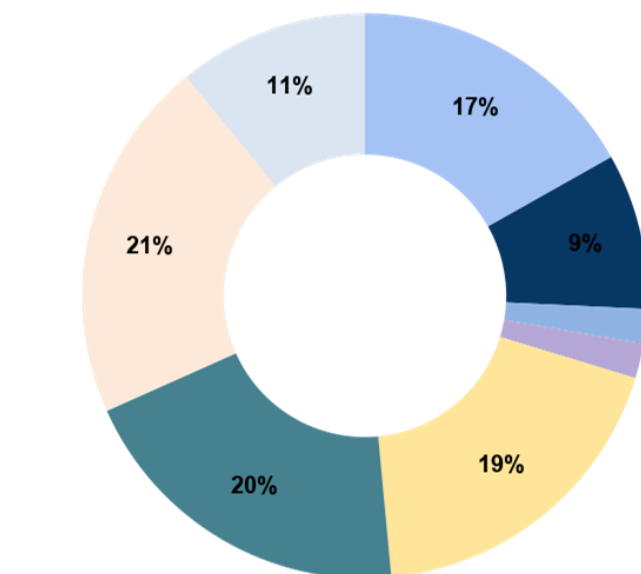
India	5 September : Cockroach Janta Party march from India Gate to New Delhi Police Headquarters
United States	11 September : 25th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks (2001) – Security reinforcements and commemorations likely in New York and Washington.
Israel	11 to 13 September : Rosh Hashanah, Jewish New Year – Transport disruption and reduced services should be expected.
India	12 to 14 September : BRICS summit in New Delhi – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected, particularly in central New Delhi.
Israel	20 to 21 September : Yom Kippur, Day of Atonement – Major transport disruption and widespread service closures should be expected.
United States	24 September : state visit by Chinese President Xi Jinping to Washington – Increased security and significant traffic disruption should be expected.
United States	21 to 28 September : UN General Assembly High-Level Week in New York – Increased security and significant traffic disruption should be expected.

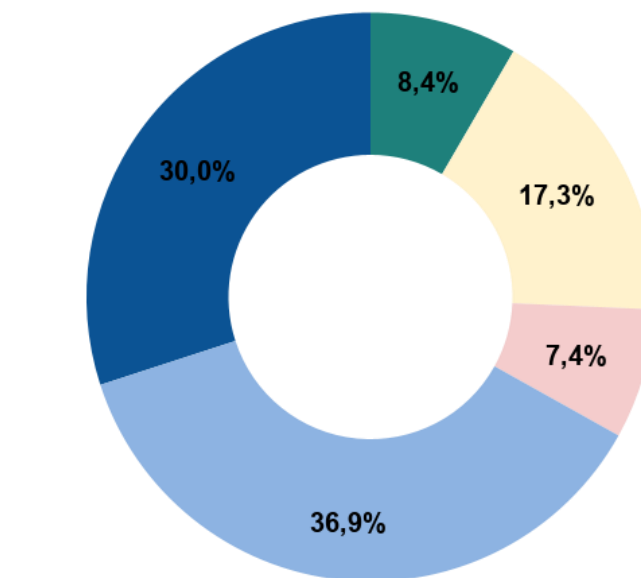
In August 2026, SSF issued a total of **1,102 safety-security alerts** concerning all kinds of risks in order to inform its customers of the latest events likely to have an impact on their interests and the safety or security of their employees throughout the world. The alerts covered **143 countries**

Geographic Distribution



109 of the alerts **were classified as either critical or urgent**, which specifically activate our **24-hour Security Operations Centre (SOC)**, notably with regards to **Colombia** (earthquake measuring 7.4 in Chocó 10/08), **Nepal/China** (Bhote Koshi flash-flooding 26-27/08) and **Niger** (attempted coup in Niamey 29-30/08).

Type of Risk



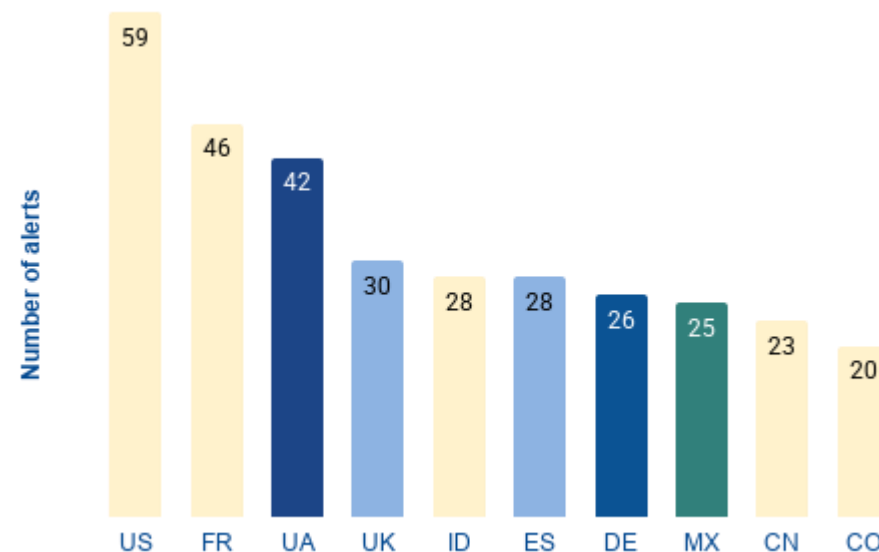

The countries that accounted for the highest number of alerts sent by SSF in August 2026 are the **United States, France, Ukraine, the United Kingdom, Indonesia, Spain, Germany, Mexico, China** and **Colombia**.

In total, these 10 countries generated **327 safety–security alerts**, representing **29%** of all the alerts sent over the last month.

Countries engaged in long-term warfare or with extremely high levels of insecurity in general (Afghanistan, Libya, Syria, Yemen, Somalia and Sudan) have been deliberately excluded from the list.

Germany

Leipzig/Halle Airport: explosive drone discovered near a Ukrainian cargo aircraft; traffic suspended for two hours (5/08). Emergency landing of a DHL cargo aircraft diverted to Hanover following a suspected collision with a flying object; no casualties (5/08). Heightened vigilance following several recent incidents targeting critical infrastructure, and with the BfV attributing a cache of weapons discovered near Berlin to Russian intelligence services – **Berlin:** attack at a school in Gosen-Neu Zittau, 2 dead, suspect arrested, believed to be a targeted attack (27/08). Fire in a 21-storey block of flats in Friedrichshain, 5 injured (14/08) – **Cologne:** shooting on Berliner Straße, 4 injured (3/08), shots fired at an empty café (31/08) – **Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania:** clashes in Schwerin during a demonstration by Generation Deutschland, a group close to the AfD, and counter-demonstrations; 2 injured (1/08) – **Dortmund:** special forces operation against an armed man barricaded in his home (15/08) – **Frankfurt:** 6 cases of malaria among airport staff, 2 deaths and 4 hospitalisations (26/08) – **Wildfires** in North Rhine-Westphalia: Hürtgenwald (Gey evacuated, 13–14/08), High Fens (Montjoie evacuated, 15 & 20/08), Saarland, 4 firefighters injured near Ottweiler (14/08).

China

Gyirong (Shigatse, Tibet): flooding and a mudslide caused by a glacier collapse on the Nepalese side; 16 dead and 546 missing, including 261 foreigners, according to official figures; roads, telecoms and electricity cut off (26–31/08). Death toll disputed by Tibetan NGOs, and at least 10 people were punished for ‘spreading false information’ (30–31/08) – **Typhoons:** three successive storms on the east and south coasts, leading to mass evacuations and repeated transport disruption. Dolphin made landfall in Zhejiang before moving inland as far as Hubei and Beijing; evacuations took place in Fujian and more than 1,500 flights were cancelled, the majority of them in Shanghai (9–12/08). Narra, which stalled in the Gulf of Tonkin before making landfall in Guangxi, causing record flooding in Chongzuo, with tens of thousands of people evacuated and shops and tourist sites closed (24–26/08); Saudel: made landfall twice in Taizhou and Wenzhou; a red alert and Level I emergency plan were in place in Zhejiang; hundreds of thousands of people were evacuated; ferry services were suspended; flights were cancelled (27–28/08) – **Earthquakes:** measuring 5.9 and 5.2 southeast of Dunhuang, with no damage reported (19–20/08); earthquake measuring 5.0 struck northern Tibet, risk of a natural dam bursting, residents and tourists evacuated (28/08).

Colombia

Earthquake measuring 7.4 near San José del Palmar (Chocó, 10/08): over 331 dead, 4,505 injured, 7 airports closed, over 11,000 homes destroyed. National state of emergency declared 3 days after the **inauguration of President Abelardo de la Espriella in Cali** (7/08), which had led to increased security and opposition protests. Aftershock measuring 4.9-struck Jordán, Santander (26/08) – **Nationwide military offensive targeting armed groups** launched by the

new president 09/08, at least 6 dead – **Cauca:** bomb attacks attributed to FARC in El Estrecho, Suárez and Caloto, 11 injured (30–31/08), and an attack on a toll booth in Mondomo, 2 officers injured (8/08) – **Guaviare:** Operation AMÓN in El Retorno, 11 FARC dissidents killed (27/08) – **Cúcuta:** truck bomb, 10 injured (1/08) – **Tolima:** attack on police officers in Ataco, 2 dead (1/08) – **Cesar:** drone attack on a police station in Curumaní, one dead (7/08) – **Antioquia:** bus set alight, attributed to ELN, in San Miguel (21/08) – **Nariño:** mine collapse in Policarpa, 13 dead (19/08) – **Caribbean Sea:** US strike, 4 suspected drug traffickers killed (25/08) – **Several wildfires**, including in Tolima and Cundinamarca; army deployed.

Spain

Ceuta: at least 67 dead (drowning, crowd movements), following an unprecedented influx of over 50,000 migrants from Morocco (30/07–1/08). **Temporary border controls reintroduced nationwide at ports and airports for travellers arriving from Italy** until 7/09, a reciprocal measure citing migratory pressure (8/08) – **Navarre:** over 40 injured in an explosion caused by fireworks at the start of the local festivities in Noàin (26/08) – **Granada:** earthquake measuring 4.8-in Alhendín, 3 injured (18/08) – **León:** 2 dead in a landslide caused by flash flooding in Manzanedo de Valdueza (15–16/08) – **Las Palmas:** one dead and two injured in the explosion of a fuel tank during construction work in Telde (5/08) – **Wildfires:** over 16,600 hectares burnt in Peñas de Riglos/San Juan de la Peña (Huesca), one soldier killed (10, 16/08). Wildfire in Collserola (Barcelona Province), 14,000 people confined to Torre Baró/Ciutat Meridiana (25/08). +630 ha burnt in Segorbe, 1,000 people evacuated in Gátova (Castellón and Valencia, 20–22/08). Community of Madrid, fire spread to Villamantilla, with evacuations in Palomeque, Manga de la Pedrera and Carbajo María Elena (19/08).

United States

Wildfires out of control in northwest: Spokane Complex (Washington), +65,000 people evacuated, state of emergency declared; 850,000 ha in Oregon in total (1–5/08); Bug Fire, state of emergency, Nevada (8–13/08) followed by Hawk Fire, Reno (22–25/08) – **Bad weather:** **Hurricane Lala, Hawaii** (15/08), 1 fatality, 125,000 homes without power, Hilo and Kona airports closed, state of emergency. **Grand Canyon/Bright Angel flash-flooding**, 20 missing (29/08). **Flooding in Columbus and central Ohio** (19–20/08). **Storms Moke** (22–24/08) and **Edouard** along Texas–Louisiana coast, flooding in Jefferson (1/09) – **Measles outbreak:** 2 dead in Lancaster (Pennsylvania), 2,813 cases nationwide as of 21/08 – **Multiple shootings nationwide:** Missaukee (Michigan), 5 dead (14/08), Twin Falls (Idaho), 3 dead (1/08), Trenton (New Jersey), 2 dead (30/08). **Other attacks:** stabbings in Times Square, New York, suspect shot dead (31/08), Boston (Massachusetts), 2 injured (13/08), Sylmar (California), 1 dead (01/08), vehicle-ramming attack, Nashville (Tennessee), 1 dead (1/08) – **Accidents:** Cessna crash, Cape Newenham (Alaska), 8 dead (20/08); industrial explosions in Toledo (Ohio), 2 dead (18/08) and Sand Springs (Oklahoma), 2 dead (27/08); bus fire in Hacienda Heights (California), one dead (21/08).

France

Intense heatwave from 01/08 to 14/08, with temperatures peaking at 38–40 °C and affecting up to 80 departments; followed by periods of thunderstorms, across 39 departments including Île-de-France (24–27/08). **Wildfires**: a particularly active fire season, with major incidents in Gironde (Le Porge), Aude (A61 closed at Carcassonne), Pas-de-Calais (2,000 campers evacuated), Landes, Lozère, Ille-et-Vilaine, Loire-Atlantique and Corse-du-Sud, leading to precautionary evacuations and road closures (2–25/08) – **Aude**: tornado in Pomas and evacuation of the Cité de Carcassonne (24/08) – **Caen**: vehicle ramming attack near the train station, 2 dead, around 10 injured (27/08) – **Toulouse**: 2 municipal police officers stabbed, attacker's remarks reportedly suggestive of a terrorist motive. (11/08) – **Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes**: 6 people injured in assault-rifle shooting in Valence (5/08), shootings in Villeurbanne and Décines-Charpieu (15, 28/08), 16 people injured in a cable car collision at Alpe d'Huez (27/08) – **Paris**: power cut in Montparnasse, Atlantic high-speed rail line disrupted (27/08).

Indonesia

Earthquake measuring 7.7 off the coast of Flores, followed by a tsunami (1 m): at least 111 dead, over 1,600 injured, extensive damage, and several thousand aftershocks (15–23/08) – **Wildfires**: sharp deterioration in August due to El Niño, with nearly 12,000 hotspots in 24 hours, including more than 5,000 in Borneo. 3.4 million people exposed to respiratory risks in seven provinces of Sumatra and Kalimantan; flight delays, school closures and a state of emergency extended until 8 September in Central Kalimantan (21–27/08) – **Jakarta**: student protests against government policies, violently dispersed (18, 27/08); simultaneous rallies in Yogyakarta and Makassar (27/08) – **Papua**: 5 workers killed by the TPNPB-OPM in Kanggime (3/08), 3 civilians wounded by gunfire in Muara Aifam, attributed to the navy by a local NGO, a claim denied by the army; march by 250 residents in Maybrat (13–19/08); drone strikes on TPNPB positions at Puncak Jaya, according to the group (16–19/08); clashes during a student demonstration in Sentani, Jayapura (15/08) – **Volcanoes**: eruption of Sinabung, alert level raised to 3 out of 4 (31/08), ash from Dukono, Halmahera (24/08).

Mexico

Military operation against a CJNG leader in Zamora (Michoacán), drug-related roadblocks and vehicles set alight, 5 civilians killed (19/08), following a security crackdown in the state's agricultural areas (6/08). 20 CJNG-linked arrests across several states (23–24/08). US strike on a vessel carrying suspected drug traffickers in the eastern Pacific, 2 dead (23/08) – **Baja California**: security alert issued by US diplomatic authorities in Mexicali (25/08) – **Guerrero**: armed attack by Los Tlacos in Cerro de las Lumbreras, 6 dead (26–27/08) – **Guanajuato**: armed attack in Irapuato, 4 dead (19/08) – **Zacatecas**: bomb attack on the Ojocaliente police station, 6 injured (30/08) – **Sinaloa**: exchange of fire between the National Guard and armed individuals in Los Mochis (9/08) – **Morelos**: tanker lorry explosion in Cuernavaca, 21 injured (6/08)

– **Puebla**: vehicle strikes pedestrians in Zacatlán, 11 injured, driver arrested (12/08) – **Mexico State**: explosions at fireworks warehouse in Zinacantepec, 1 dead (6/08), and at a pyrotechnics workshop in San Pedro de la Laguna, 6 injured (28/08). **Mexico City**, 13 firefighters injured in accidental explosion in Roma Norte (12/08). Flooding in La Magdalena and Tlalpan (7–8/08). Ongoing social protests.

United Kingdom

Stabbings in London and its suburbs: 4 people injured in Covent Garden, suspect arrested (5/08); 1 dead and 2 injured in Shepherd's Bush (18/08); 1 dead in Wembley (25/08) – **Transport**: Southern Rail train derails in Lewes (East Sussex), 11 of the 150 passengers injured, two seriously; Brighton/Gatwick services suspended (13/08). Second derailment, no injuries in Wickford, Essex (14/08). Collision on the A66 at South Bank (North Yorkshire), seven dead (22/08). Flooding in terminals at Heathrow Airport, access disrupted (15/08). Norwich Airport closed for 24 hours (28/08). Bristol Airport suspended due to runway problems (night of 7–8/08). Repeated strikes on East Midlands Railway (1, 8, 15, 30–31/08). Strike by Arriva North London bus drivers (14–15/08) – **West Midlands**: wildfire covering over 200 ha, 19 homes destroyed, 300 people evacuated, disruption on the M6 (13–15/08) – **London**: industrial fires in Neasden (28/08), Barking/Dagenham, A13 closed (13/08) and Mitcham, rail services to Sutton suspended (26/08). UKIP demonstrations and "Stand Up to Racism" counter-demonstrations (29/08), PTI UK in eight towns (5/08) – **Bristol**: anti-immigration demonstration and counter-demonstration (8/08), amid tension and reports of anti-migrant clashes in Thetford (Norfolk, 4–7/08) – **Manchester**: operating theatre strike in 4 hospitals (26, 28/08).

Ukraine

Sustained Russian strikes across the country: several deadly waves of attacks on **Kyiv** and heavy shelling of the ports of **Odessa** and **Izmail**, severely disrupting grain exports from the Black Sea. Stocks of long-range interceptors in sharp decline and increased use of jet-powered drones by Russian army, coupled with **inability to handle large-scale launches**: none of the 28 missiles fired at Kyiv were shot down (5/08). **Targeting of transport and civilians**: passenger train in Odessa Oblast (13/08), minibus in Kherson, 4 dead (19/08), bus in occupied Luhansk, 9 dead (26/08). Moscow announces it has reached the outskirts of Sloviansk (27/08); Moscow declares peace talks to be on a "deep pause", a few days after the CIA director's visit to Russian capital (25/08). **Political unrest in Kyiv**: former Defence Minister Mykhailo Fedorov publicly raises issue of elections (18/08), Zelenskyy responding that elections would tear the country apart – **Kryvyi Rih**: 16 killed and 130 injured in Russian drone strikes on a shopping centre (21/08) – **Odessa**: Moldovan border posts at Tabaky and Vynohradivka damaged, traffic suspended (21, 26/08) – **Zaporizhzhia**: risk of a total shutdown at nuclear power station, cut off from external power since the 20/08.

Ghana: planned power outages in Accra and the Ashanti Region – Disruption to services and local activity to be expected.

1 September

Uganda: potential demonstration outside the Turkish Embassy in Kampala – Localised traffic disruption to be expected if the protest proceeds, increased security and tension should not be ruled out.

Zambia: inauguration ceremony of President Hakainde Hichilema in Lusaka – Increased security measures and traffic disruption expected.

6 September

Eswatini: National Day.

Zimbabwe: anniversary of the death of former President Robert Mugabe (2019).

7 September

Mozambique: Victory Day (1974).

11 September

Ethiopia : Ethiopian New Year – Security reinforcements expected.

12 September

Ethiopia: anniversary of Emperor Haile Selassie being overthrown by an Ethiopian military junta – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Nigeria: publication of the final list of candidates for the 2027 presidential election – Protests and tension should not be ruled out.

South Sudan: anniversary of the peace agreement signed in 2018 – Armed incidents should not be ruled out.

13 September

Kenya: anniversary of William Ruto entering the presidential office (2022) – High risk of anti-government demonstrations, unrest should not be ruled out.

16 September

Kenya: sentencing of former Migori Governor Okoth Obado for the murder of university student Sharon Otieno – Protests and tension should not be ruled out.

21 September

Ghana: Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Day – Disruption likely on the occasion of the public holiday.

Kenya: anniversary of the attack on the Westgate Shopping Mall in Nairobi by Shebab militants (2013) – Commemorations likely.

22 September

Mali: Independence Day.

24 September

Guinea Bissau: Independence Day (1974) - Celebrations likely.

South Africa: Heritage Day.

25 September

Mozambique: Revolution Day (1964) in celebration of the country's armed forces.

27 September

São Tomé and Príncipe: legislative and local elections – Increased security and political rallies should not be ruled out

30 September

Botswana: Independence Day (1966).

The Americas



1 September

Venezuela: reopening of Caracas Simón Bolívar International Airport (Maiquetía) following damage caused by the 24 June earthquakes – Gradual resumption of flights and air transport disruption expected.

2 September

Nicaragua : anniversary of the creation of the Nicaraguan army (1979).

3 to 4 September

Argentina: civil aviation employees on strike – Air traffic disruption should be expected, related demonstrations should not be ruled out.

3 September

Chile: Madrid Forum bringing together far-right Latin American leaders in Santiago – Increased security, risk of demonstrations and tension.

Panama: reduction in transits through the Panama Canal due to the El Niño phenomenon to take effect – Disruption to maritime and freight traffic expected.

6 September

Antilles/Cuba/United States: anniversary of the deadly Hurricane Irma (2017).

7 September

Brazil: Independence Day (1822), military parades likely in Brasilia with President Lula in attendance – Security reinforcements should be expected, including a risk of pro and anti-government demonstrations nationwide.

Mexico: anniversary of the earthquake measuring 8.2 off the coast of Chiapas (over 100 dead, 2017) - Commemorations possible.

7 September

Panama: inauguration ceremony for the new Panama Canal Administrator, Ilya Espino de Marotta, at the Panama Canal Authority headquarters – Localised disruption should be expected around the site.

8 September

United States: opening of the 81st session of the UN General Assembly in New York – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected.

9 to 10 September

United States: Republican Party convention in Dallas ahead of the midterm elections – High attendance and localised disruption should be expected.

10 to 20 September

Canada: Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF) – High attendance and localised traffic disruption should be expected.

11 September

Chile: commemoration of the death of President Salvador Allende (1973) and anniversary of the coup by Augusto Pinochet (1973) – Rallies possible.

United States: 25th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks (2001) – Security reinforcements and commemorations likely in New York and Washington.

12 September

Peru: anniversary of the arrest of the leader of the Shining Path (SL) guerrilla – High risk of attacks.

15 September

Costa Rica: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations likely.

El Salvador: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations likely.

Guatemala: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations likely.

Honduras: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations to be expected, opposition demonstrations should not be ruled out, especially in Tegucigalpa.

Mexico: “Grito de Dolores” (1810) ahead of Independence Day.

Nicaragua: Independence Day (1821) – Opposition rallies should not be ruled out.

16 September

Mexico: Independence Day (1821) military parade – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

18 to 19 September

Chile: Independence Day (18 September) and Day of the Glories of the Army (19 September).

19 September

Haiti: anniversary of the arrival of US soldiers in order to reinstate Haitian President Aristide in Port-au-Prince.

Mexico: anniversary of the earthquake measuring 7.1 in Puebla State (369 dead, 2017) – Commemorations possible.

Saint Kitts and Nevis: Independence Day (1983) – Disruption likely.

20 to 27 September

United States: Climate Week NYC – High attendance and localised traffic disruption should be expected.

21 to 28 September

United States: UN General Assembly High-Level Week in New York – Increased security and significant traffic disruption should be expected.

21 September

Belize: Independence Day (1981).

24 September

United States: state visit by Chinese President Xi Jinping to Washington – Increased security and significant traffic disruption should be expected.

26 September

Colombia: 10th anniversary of the peace treaty between the FARC and the Colombian government (2016) – Demonstrations likely.

Mexico: annual march by the families of the missing students of Ayotzinapa in Mexico City.

30 September ...

Haiti : anniversary of the coup against Jean-Bertrand Aristide (1991).

Asia - Pacific

30 August to 4 September

Palau: Pacific Islands Forum Leaders Meeting in Koror – Increased security and disruption to flights and road traffic to be expected.

31 August to 1 September

Kyrgyzstan: Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit in Bishkek – Increased security and disruption to road traffic and flights to be expected.

31 August to 6 September

Kyrgyzstan: World Nomad Games in Bishkek – Large crowds, increased security and traffic disruption to be expected.

1 September

India: “Election Commission Chalo” protest at Freedom Park in Bengaluru against electoral-roll revisions – Localised traffic disruption to be expected, risk of clashes should not be ruled out.

Uzbekistan: Independence Day (1991).

2 September

Australia: ferry strike in Sydney – Disruption to ferry services and increased pressure on alternative transport networks to be expected, demonstrations near ferry facilities should not be ruled out.

Australia: 24-hour strike by University of Sydney staff – Localised disruption to be expected around the campus, demonstrations should not be ruled out.

2 September

India: AJYCP protest at Jantar Mantar in Delhi calling for Assam’s flood and erosion crisis to be declared a national issue – Localised traffic disruption to be expected, tension should not be ruled out.

Japan: anniversary of Japan's surrender ending the Second World War – Commemorations possible.

Taiwan: demonstration in support of imprisoned Hong Kong activists outside the Legislative Yuan in Taipei – Localised transport disruption to be expected, increased security and possible temporary access restrictions.

Vietnam: Independence Day (1945) and anniversary of the death of Vietnamese leader, President Ho Chi Minh (1969) - Commemorations likely.

3 September

China: Victory Day over Japan in the Second World War (1945), including a military parade on Place Tiananmen – Localised disruption should be expected.

Pakistan: nationwide strike called by Jamaat-e-Islami against the petroleum levy – Significant disruption to road traffic and commercial activity to be expected, demonstrations should not be ruled out.

5 September

Australia: ferry workers to strike in Brisbane, coinciding with the Riverfire festival – Public transport and traffic disruption should be expected.

Bangladesh: 11-party alliance protest march from Dhaka to Chattogram – Traffic disruption should be expected along the route, with increased security and tension not to be ruled out.

Pakistan: Defence Day – Ceremonies and military parades likely.

7 September

Fiji: Constitution Day.

9 September

China: 50th anniversary of Mao Zedong's death in Beijing – High attendance and access restrictions should be expected around Tiananmen Square.

North Korea: anniversary of the declaration of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (1948) – Celebrations should be expected.

Tajikistan: Independence Day (1991).

11 September

Pakistan: anniversary of the death of Muhammad Ali Jinnah (1948) – Commemorative rallies in Islamabad, Karachi, Lahore and Peshawar should not be ruled out.

12 au 14 September

India: BRICS summit in New Delhi – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected, particularly in central New Delhi.

14 September

India: Ganesh Chaturthi festival – Increased security and disruption expected.

Philippines: provincial parliamentary elections in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) – Increased security and disruption to be expected.

15 to 17 September

China: Xiangshan Forum, an annual security and defence meeting in Beijing – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected.

16 September

Hong Kong: annual Policy Address by Chief Executive John Lee – Localised disruption should be expected around the Legislative Council.

Papua New Guinea: Independence Day (1975) - Commemorations likely.

19 September

Nepal: Constitution Day – Celebrations and disruption likely.

Thailand: anniversary of the coup against Thaksin Shinawatra (2006) – Demonstrations likely.

19 September to 4 October

Japan: Aichi-Nagoya Asian Games – High attendance and localised disruption to transport should be expected.

24 to 26 September

Azerbaijan: Azerbaijan Formula 1 Grand Prix in Baku – High attendance and significant traffic disruption should be expected.

26 September

Myanmar: anniversary of the junta's crackdown on the Saffron Revolution (2007).

27 September

Hong Kong (RAS China): anniversary of the crackdown on the 2014 protests – Low risk of pro-democracy demonstrations.

Europe



1 to 4 September

Russia: Eastern Economic Forum – Increased security measures and disruptions expected in Vladivostok.

1 to 6 September

Germany: “Rheinmetall Disarm” protest camp in Cologne – Localised traffic disruption to be expected, increased security and tension should not be ruled out.
United Kingdom: meeting between French President Emmanuel Macron and British Prime Minister Andy Burnham in London – Increased security measures expected, with localised disruption not ruled out.

1 September

Cyprus: visit by Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan to Nicosia, in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) – Increased security, tension should not be ruled out.

France: decree on the implementation measures for France’s anti-fast-fashion law set to come into force – Increased regulatory oversight, enhanced monitoring of affected platforms and possible public reactions or protests possible.

Poland: anniversary of the start of the Second World War when the German troops entered Poland (1939) – Remembrance services likely.

2 to 3 September

Germany: meeting of the French, German and Polish foreign ministers as part of the “Weimar Triangle” in Weimar – Increased security and localised disruption should not be ruled out.

2 to 4 September

Liechtenstein: parliamentary session during which an initiative in favour of abortion is due to be debated – Demonstrations and tension should not be ruled out.

2 to 6 September

Ukraine: Ukrainian Fashion Week in Kyiv – Increased security and risk of Russian attacks should not be ruled out.

2 to 12 September

Italy: Venice Film Festival – Increased security and large crowds expected.

2 September

Estonia: first attempt by Parliament to elect the new head of state in Tallinn – Increased security expected, tension should not be ruled out.

Spain: demonstrations in several cities following the migration crisis in Ceuta – Risk of tension and clashes between protesters and police.

3 to 5 September

United Kingdom: Reform UK annual conference in Birmingham – Increased security, risk of demonstrations and tension.

3 September

San Marino: National Day.

Spain: Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez to address MPs on the Ceuta crisis in Madrid – Increased security, risk of demonstrations and tension.

4 to 6 September

France: pilots at Volotea set to strike – Flight disruption, delays and cancellations to be expected.

Italy: Formula 1 Italian Grand Prix in Monza – Increased security and large crowds expected.

4 to 13 September

France: Deauville American Film Festival – Increased security and disruption expected.

4 September

Italy: 8-hour strike by AMT staff in Genoa – Public transport disruptions should be expected.

Netherlands: nationwide strike by port workers affiliated with FNV Havens – Disruption to port operations in Rotterdam, Amsterdam and Zeeland to be expected, demonstrations and localised traffic disruption should not be ruled out.

5 to 6 September

France: Grande Braderie de Lille annual street market – Increased security likely.

5 September

Croatia: civil society protest in Zagreb against waste management and in support of environmental protection – Traffic disruption to be expected, localised demonstrations and tension should not be ruled out.

Germany: demonstration against rising rents in Berlin ahead of local elections – Traffic disruption expected, risk of tension.

Germany: demonstration in support of religious freedom in Hamburg – Traffic disruption to be expected.

Germany: peace demonstration in Frankfurt – Localised traffic disruption to be expected.

Greece: farmers to protest in Thessaloniki – Increased security and traffic disruption should be expected around the White Tower.

Italy: anti-fascist march in Rome as part of Renoize 2026 – Traffic disruption to be expected, tension and counter-demonstrations should not be ruled out.

Italy: 4-hour strike by ATVO staff in Venice – Public transport disruption should be expected.

Portugal: activists to rally in Lisbon against EU immigration policies – Increased security, localised transport disruptions and risk of scuffles should be expected.

Serbia: Belgrade Pride Parade – Increased security and localised disruption expected.

6 to 8 September

Denmark: visit by European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen to Greenland – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected.

6 September

France: ceremony commemorating deportees and victims of the Holocaust in Paris – Increased security should be expected.

Germany: state elections in Saxony-Anhalt – Localised disruption should be expected around polling stations.

7 to 14 September

France: trial in Paris of two sons of former Yemeni President Ali Abdullah Saleh on money laundering and embezzlement charges.

7 September to 9 October

Switzerland: 63rd session of the United Nations Human Rights Council in Geneva – Increased security measures and occasional demonstrations expected around UN premises.

7 September

Belgium: resumption in Mons of a lawsuit brought by a farmer against TotalEnergies, whom he holds responsible for climate-related damage – Isolated protests near the courthouse cannot be ruled out.

Finland: completion of construction of the barrier along the eastern border, with a press conference in Nuijamaa – Disruption should be expected around the border area, with possible traffic restrictions.

8 to 11 September

Poland: International Defence Industry Exhibition in Kielce – High attendance and localised traffic disruption should be expected.

8 September

Andorra: National Day.

North Macedonia: Independence Day (1991) - Security reinforcements and celebrations likely.

9 to 10 September

France: International Space Summit at the Grand Palais in Paris, bringing together numerous foreign delegations – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected.

9 September

Netherlands: 24-hour nationwide public transport strike – Major disruption to rail and public transport services to be expected.

11 to 13 September

Spain: Spanish Formula 1 Grand Prix in Madrid – High attendance and traffic disruption should be expected.

11 September

Spain: National Day of Catalonia (Diada) – Rallies expected among Catalan supporters of independence, notably led by the ANC, in Barcelona; unrest should not be ruled out.

12 to 14 September

United Kingdom: Extinction Rebellion's "Love & Rage" protest in London – Increased security and traffic disruption to be expected.

13 September

Sweden: parliamentary, regional and municipal elections – Localised disruption should be expected, with a risk of protests and tensions.

14 to 18 September

Austria: 70th Annual General Conference of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) in Vienna – Increased security measures expected.

15 September

France: anniversary of the attack on the Publicis Drugstore in Saint-Germain – Commemorations possible.

16 to 28 September

France: trial of Rachida Dati and Carlos Ghosn in Paris for corruption and influence peddling – Significant media presence should be expected.

16 September

France: European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen's annual State of the Union address at the European Parliament in Strasbourg – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected.

Netherlands: verdict in the war crimes and crimes against humanity trial of former Kosovo Liberation Army (KLA) leaders in The Hague – Protests and tensions cannot be ruled out.

17 to 21 September

United Kingdom: London Fashion Week – High attendance and localised disruption should be expected.

17 September

Greece : anniversary of the start of the Civil War (1946) - Commemorations likely.

18 to 20 September

Russia: legislative elections to renew all 450 seats in the State Duma, the lower house of parliament – Increased security and localised restrictions should be expected.

19 September to 4 October

Germany: Oktoberfest in Munich – Disruption and increased security expected.

19 September

United Kingdom: anniversary of the referendum on Scottish independence (2014) – Demonstrations possible.

20 September

Germany: state and local elections in Berlin – Localised disruption should be expected.

21 September

Armenia: Independence Day (1991).

Germany: nationwide IG Metall day of action in the automotive industry – Traffic and industrial disruption should be expected, with localised protests not to be ruled out.

Malta: Independence Day (1964).

22 September

Bulgaria: Independence Day (1908).

Netherlands: ICC verdict in the trial of a former alleged Seleka commander, accused of war crimes and crimes against humanity in CAR.

24 September

Kosovo: third anniversary of the Banjska attack – Commemorations possible.

25 to 28 September

France: visit by Pope Leo XIV to France – Large crowds, increased security and significant traffic disruption should be expected.

26 to 29 September

France: national demonstrations led by firefighters calling for increased resources and staffing – Traffic disruption and protests should be expected.

26 September

Germany: demonstration by the DGB trade union confederation in Berlin against reforms – Traffic disruption and tension should not be ruled out.

27 to 30 September

United Kingdom: Labour Party annual conference in Liverpool – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected.

27 September

Switzerland: referendums on strengthening neutrality and food security – Localised disruption to be expected, demonstrations should not be ruled out.

28 to 29 September

Belgium: EU Agriculture Ministers' meeting in Brussels – Increased security and localised traffic disruption should be expected, agricultural demonstrations should not be ruled out.



Middle East-North Africa

6 September

Türkiye: extraordinary congress of the pro-Kurdish DEM Party – Increased security should be expected, with a risk of protests and tensions.

7 to 10 September

Tunisia: international forum on artificial intelligence under the auspices of the Arab League in Hammamet – High attendance and increased security should be expected.

8 September

Morocco: anniversary of the earthquake measuring 6.8 in Marrakesh (at least 3,000 dead, 2023) – Commemorations possible.

9 September

Afghanistan: anniversary of the death of Ahmed Shah Massoud (2001).

10 to 22 September

Morocco: electoral campaign ahead of the legislative elections – Protests and localised disruption cannot be ruled out.

10 September

Libya: anniversary of flooding that resulted in loss of life in Derna (2023) - Commemorations possible.

11 to 13 September

Israel: Rosh Hashanah, Jewish New Year – Transport disruption and reduced services should be expected.

11 September

Libya: anniversary of the terrorist attack on the US Consulate in Benghazi, in which the American ambassador was killed (2012).

13 September

Israel/Palestine: anniversary of the signing of the Oslo Accords (1993).

15 September

Bahrain and Morocco: 6th anniversary of the normalisation of relations with Israel – Pro-Palestine demonstrations possible in Manama and Casablanca.

16 September

Algeria: anniversary of the referendum on the Civil Concord Law, which gave amnesty to armed Islamists (1999).

Iran: anniversary of the death of Mahsa Amini, arrested for allegedly wearing her hijab “improperly” – Security reinforcements and demonstrations to be expected, including a high risk of unrest.

20 to 21 September

Israel: Yom Kippur, Day of Atonement – Major transport disruption and widespread service closures should be expected.

21 September

Yemen : anniversary of the capture of Sanaa by the Houthis – Commemorations likely.

22 to 28 September

Iran: Sacred Defence Week – Official commemorations, military parades, heightened security and increased patriotic events expected amid ongoing US-Iran conflict.

22 September

Iran/Iraq: anniversary of the start of the Iran-Iraq war (1980-1988), followed in Iran by Sacred Defence Week with military parades.

23 September

Morocco: legislative elections – Increased security and localised disruption should be expected, with a risk of protests and tensions.

Saudi Arabia: National Day.

26 September

Yemen: anniversary of the 1962 revolution.

28 September

Israel : anniversary of the death of former Israeli President Shimon Peres (2016) – Commemorations likely.

World

15 September

World: International Day of Democracy – Demonstrations should be expected.

21 September

World: International Day of Peace - Demonstrations likely.

26 September

World: International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons.



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
